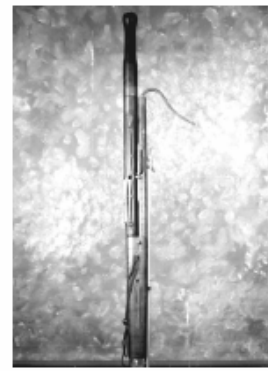

A respected member of the community, and former member of the Carolers Association, Sherman L. Seitz, gave me a bassoon. Thank you Mr. Seitz.

In 1972 the Glen Rock Carolers Association published a book "Salute This Happy Morn: A History Of The Glen Rock Carol Singers." by Charles H. Glatfelter, Ph.D. At the bottom of page 13 is a photograph of a bassoon.

"This bassoon belonged to Oscar L. Seitz and later to this son, Sherman L. Seitz. It was probably the one which Oscar Seitz used as a member of the Glen Rock Band and of the carol singers. Sherman Seitz believed that it may well have been the bassoon used by James Heathcoate in 1841."
